Continuous occurrence of these disasters destroys the livelihoods of small and marginal farmers, agricultural labourers, village artisans and poor by making them vulnerable.

In 2018, Odisha became the first state in India to have in place the early warning dissemination system (EWDS) along its 480km long coastline. The primary aim of EWDS is a full-proof communication system to address the existing gap in disseminating disaster warning by strengthening the emergency operation centres in the state, district and block levels. It aims to save lives and property near coastal areas.



122 locations

1,205 villages from 22 blocks in six coastal districts have been covered under EWDS. As part of the system, watch towers have been set up at 122 locations within 1.5 km from the coastline for dissemination of cyclone/ tsunami warning through sirens and mass messaging.



1,000 people

Odisha boasts of 870 cyclone and flood shelters, each capable of accommodating 1,000 people



22,000 village level

There are 16 district-level disaster management planning committees which reach out to 155 such committees at block and 22,000 at the village level.




